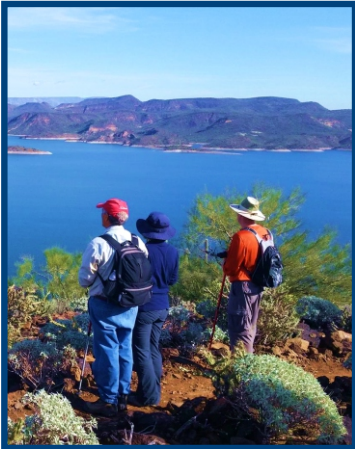


WHAT WILL THE PARKS VISION 2030 ACCOMPLISH



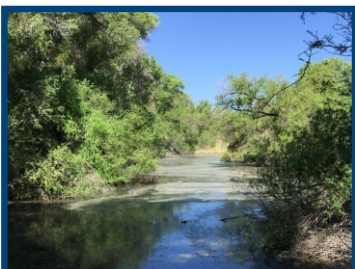

- In 1965 the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors in collaboration with local, state, and federal leaders and concern citizens adopted the first Maricopa County Regional Park System Plan in response to unprecedented growth.
- Accordingly, the Plan identified the importance of protecting large unspoiled regional parks to preserve our natural heritage for future generations.
- The parks were to serve as a retreat and an escape from the busy urban environment.
- The plan and the people who developed it left us a legacy of regional parks and open spaces that are recognized nationally as a model for integrating natural spaces in a growing urban region.
