2009 Gallup Arizona Survey & The Arizona We Want

- A first-of-its-kind statewide survey in the nation.
- Created the foundation for The Arizona We Want, a shared longterm vision for Arizona as envisioned by the people who live here.
- Led to the development of the Arizona We Want Progress Meters to advance data-driven dialogue, decision making, and action.

Building on a Strong Foundation of Work



Catalyst for community-led change. For example:

- Development and use of the Education Progress Meter in partnership with Expect More Arizona that has been adopted by over 60 cities and towns and informed policy and investment at city, regional and state levels.
- Northern Arizona Council of Governments (NACOG) integrated Progress
 Meters into their Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS),
 receiving national recognition.
- Informing the Flinn Foundation's creation of the Arizona Center for Civic Leadership which plays a central role in developing the state's pipeline of civic leaders.



What CFA set out to accomplish through the new Gallup Arizona Project

- Field the 2020 Gallup Arizona Survey.
- Identify what matters most to Arizonans across a broad set of critical issues.
- Share data and results to help inform policy making and action.
- Energize communities and leaders around shared priorities to solve public problems.
- Create a statewide agenda around what unites us as Arizonans.



Young, college-educated Arizonans are are less likely to be optimistic about life in Arizona.

- 34% agree Arizona is headed in the right direction vs. 45% of all other Arizonans
- 45% of them agree that Arizona is the perfect place for them vs. 64% of all Arizonans



Two-thirds of Arizonans overall say it is important to make quality preschool programs available for families that want it, but this figure rises to:

- 76% among Latino Arizonans
- 76% among Arizonans living in the state's Southeastern region
- 73% among millennial-age Arizonans
- 72% among Arizonans making less than \$36,000 a year









Among employed Arizonans: Thinking about your primary job, how satisfied or dissatisfied are you with each of the following? Percent 'satisfied'












"Ending systemic racism"








Typically, how would you rate the following in Arizona? Percent "excellent" or "good"






Typically, how would you rate "outdoor parks, playgrounds and trails" in Arizona? (MC Residents) Percent "excellent" or "good"









How important is it that Arizona make the following changes over the next 10 years? Percent 'very important' or 'important'




How important is it that Arizona make the following changes over the next 10 years? Percent 'very important' or 'important'


How important is it that Arizona make the following changes over the next 10 years? (MC Residents) Percent "very important" and "important"


How important is it that Arizona make the following changes over the next 10 years? Percent 'very important' or 'important'

Shared Public Values

For the purposes of this study, shared public values are defined as issues on which at least 70% or more of Arizonans agree — regardless of geography, income, education level, race or ethnicity. They clearly identify where we agree and what Arizonans want.

Arizonans Agree on Seven Shared Public Values:

- Affordable healthcare that covers preexisting conditions and provides accessible mental health services.
- 3) Good-paying jobs and the education and training needed for all Arizonans to fully participate in a vibrant economy.
- 4) Sustainable practices that protect our air, land and water and support a high quality of life for all.
- 5) Civic engagement that solves problems and democracy that works for all.
- 6) Fair, just, and equal treatment of all people
- 7) Comprehensive immigration reform, including a pathway to citizenship and support for "DREAMers".
