Re: Director's Summary of Current Events

Listed below are activities the department has been involved with during **November and December 2021**.

The Strategic System Master Plan:

- In November 2021, two virtual public meetings were held for the Strategic System Master Plan: Parks Vision 2030. Participants included 71 people on Monday, November 8th at 5:30 p.m. and 46 people on Wednesday, November 10th at noon. Approximately 101 total comments and questions were received from the public meeting registration form or at the public meetings.
- In December 2021, an Executive Team meeting was held where results from past outreach efforts were reviewed as well as a status update provided on the project.
- The Parks Vision 2030 Public Outreach Feedback Form opened on November 8th, the day of the first public meeting. This on-line questionnaire was another opportunity for members of the public to make their voice heard if they could not attend one of the public meetings. The original deadline was December 10th but due to many additional responses coming in, the survey was kept open through December 31, 2021. The effort proved to be highly successful. A goal of 500 individual responses was set as a benchmark for success. A total of 1,400 responses were received in English and 20 in Spanish for a total of 1,420 responses to the online public feedback form.
- Work on the Strategic System Master Plan continued with sections being drafted on programs, wildlife corridors, trends, and regional plans. There has also been coordination with the Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG) relating to a research project associated with reviewing demographic data around the river corridors. The initial project will begin by looking at demographic data within ½ mile of the Salt and Agua Fria Rivers in certain locations that have already been established by the Maricopa County Department of Public Health.
- A proposal was also submitted for a conference session about the Parks Vision 2030 project at the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) Conference being held in Phoenix, AZ this September.

Veteran's Day: 181 free passes were provided on November 11 to current and past services members to honor their commitment to our country and say thank you!

National Take a Hike Day: 508 free entry passes were provided for visitors on November 17, 2021, to park visitors so they could enjoy the County Parks and trails.



Training Hours (FY22 through December 2021):





Planning and Development Division

Project Management

- The project manager completed the Desert Outdoor Center dorm roof beam repair project in November. This
 project involved replacing sections of deteriorated wood and wrapping the beams with painted sheet metal to
 protect them.
- Failing septic systems at Lake Pleasant 10-Lane boat ramp and Roadrunner Campground were repaired in December. This involved pumping septic tanks, water jetting sewer lines, and cleaning debris from manholes.
- The Overlook Well replacement project started in December and will be completed in January. This involves replacing the pump, motor and cleaning the well casing.

Trades Crew

• Due to excessive erosion and sediment buildup, the Trades team reworked the Lake Pleasant North water tank service road. The Crew cleaned out the sediment in the ditches and reworked the drainage so that the road and road edge will last longer and need less maintenance. Also, while working up at the North end, the Trades Team removed the vegetation and trees from the North ET bed. Several 15' trees were removed from the bed as well.

- Repaired and graded six trailhead and horse access areas at Usery Park. This was necessary due to storm damage and heavy usage.
- Repaired the old parking lot at San Tan park. This was done to prepare for overflow use.
- Troubleshot and repaired the burnt electrical panel at White Tanks Group area restroom. (The breaker panel caught on fire and needed a complete rebuild.)
- Cleaned up trash, screened dirt, and repaired road edges behind the Nature Center at Estrella Park.
- · Repaired the gas regulator at the DOC for the water heaters.
- Repaired and/or replaced three non-working water mixing valves at Usery Park.
- Custom fabricated seven cuts in the cable fence for park access at the Estrella Park turf area.
- Repaired lighting, pedestals, and other electrical issues at the Roadrunner and Bajada campgrounds at Lake Pleasant as well as the Cave Creek campground and Estrella Maintenance compound.
- Completed the storm damage and drainage issues behind the DOC main building and amphitheater.
- Repaired and replaced the Estrella pump station jockey pump electrical issue and relay contactor.
- Removed and custom fabricated a new gate for Estrella Park's 143rd Avenue entrance. (This was a risk claim)
- Troubleshot and installed a new pump at the Scute Loop septic lift station.
- Repaired the broken 8" domestic waterline at Estrella park.
- Performed and completed the electrical overhaul and rebuild of the DOC critter cage electrical and lighting.
- Repaired the HVAC system at San Tan Park.
- Graded and repaired the Estrella Competitive Track and the Coldwater utility roads due to erosion and storm damage.
- Repaired pedestals and other electrical issues at Usery, Estrella, Lake Pleasant, Cave Creek, McDowell, and White Tanks campgrounds.
- Custom fabricated and installed two new envelope boxes on two Iron Rangers at San Tan Park.
- Rebuilt exterior light fixtures at the Cave Creek and Usery Nature Centers.

Maricopa Trail, Sun Circle, and Trailhead Facilities:

The following trail segments are currently in progress – 1, 6, 7, 18, 22, 27, 33, 35 76, and 77.

- Agreement preparation/negotiations
 - o City of Phoenix IGA for Segment 7 Sun Circle/Maricopa Trail in review by the City of Phoenix.
 - o CAP License application for Segment 76 submitted 12/15/2020.
 - WAPA (Western Area Power Administration) license applications (four) for Segment 76 approved 7/20/21.
 Verbally approved; pending receipt of the license for submittal to Board of Supervisors.
 - o MCFCD (Flood Control District) Permits submitted for Segments 1.
 - o ADOT Guadalupe Bridge re-construction with the multi-use path in planning.
- Construction
 - o Repaired Segment 12 Waddell Canal Trail in November 2021.
 - Repaired major fire and erosion damage on Segment 22 in December 2021 with NWWS (Northwest Woodland Services).

Maintenance

- o Groomed tread and brushed the following segments this period: 12, 13, and 14.
- Conducted trail maintenance training for Parks Maintenance crews in December with a second session scheduled for January 2022.
- Scheduled AmeriCorps (ACE) crew deployment for January 2022 with three crews at Cave Creek, Lake Pleasant, and Maricopa Trail Segment 22.
- o Developing alternative plans for Merkle Trail repair at Usery Park.
- Route Determination
 - Segment 77 Vulture Mountain to Lake Pleasant Submitted route to BLM 1/25/21. Refined new trail routes in January and April 2021. Site visits completed April 2021.
 - Segment 76 White Tank to Vulture Mountain Submitted route to BLM 1/25/21. Site visits completed May 2021. Refined route December 2021. Holding monthly BLM (Bureau of Land Management) meetings. Working with BOR (Bureau of Reclamation) and CAP (Central Arizona Project) on CAP canal alignment near Hassayampa River.
 - Laid out the new connector trail at Usery and in the process of scheduling the Cultural Resource Survey.

Natural Resources


- The Natural Resource Specialist has been working with CAZCA (Central Arizona Conservation Alliance), Arizona Master Naturalists, and the Parks' PIO, interpretive rangers, and volunteer coordinator to provide ample opportunities to get the public involved and engaged in park natural resource stewardship. The Winter-Spring 2022 Desert Defenders Program has been developed with 20 scheduled Desert Defenders mapping and invasive removal volunteer events planned.
- The Natural Resource Specialist has developed an evaluation and scoring system titled "Natural Resource Evaluation Score" (NES) and includes ten elements: Natural Community Quality, Natural Community Rarity, Native and Key Species Rarity, Natural Resource Sensitivity, Diversity, Landscape Ecology, Geology/Physical Features, Water Resources, Boundaries and Management Access, and Restoration needs. Each element has a score that can rank from 0 to 5, with 5 being the highest score/quality, and the highest possible overall score for each park is 50 (10x5). Each park will soon be evaluated and scored using the NES system. The evaluation form has explanations provided for each element of how that element's score was determined and will include maps with hydrological, biological, and other data that will be used to aid in the scoring process. The NES will help to prioritize any future funding use for community enhancement projects and conservation efforts, with higher quality sights being favored for projects.


Parks Operations Report

Cave Creek Regional Park

- The maintenance crew has been busy assisting the hosts with the campground, trimming trees, and completing minor repairs to various facilities. They have also helped the Adobe hosts remove illegally dumped materials.
- In partnership with Aravaipa Running, the park hosted the *Thriller/Thrasher* run. The *Thriller* day and *Thrasher* night runs feature a 50K, 24K, 11K, and 5K in the morning and a 30K, 20K, 10K, and 5K at night. The 50K starts at Lake Pleasant and follows the Maricopa Trail to Cave Creek Regional Park, while the 24K starts at the Anthem Trailhead and follows the Maricopa Trail to Cave Creek Park. All other races are entirely within the Cave Creek Regional Park. This event was a great success with 435 participants registered for the various runs.

Estrella Mountain Regional Park

- Due to the recent rains causing growth, the maintenance crew and hosts have been pruning the trees and bushes and removing weeds. The roadsides and entry area have had a visual improvement with the work performed.
- On the December 4th weekend, an Equestrian long-distance endurance ride with nearly 80 participants occurred using 60 miles of trails. In addition, there were two running events with about 400 runners.
- Staff met with the Arizona Game and Fish Grant Coordinator to consider a grant for Joe Foss Shooting Range's backstops.

Hassayampa River Preserve

- The new host arrived for the season and began training and orientation to the Preserve.
- Staff and the Nature Conservancy conducted the annual conservation easement monitoring.
- Park staff participated in the Innovation Studio interviews and focus groups.
- Park staff and volunteers planted cactus received from the Vulture Mountains salvage project.
- The park supervisor attended a trail maintenance assessment training at Estrella Mountain Regional Park.
- White Tank maintenance personnel assisted with some minor plumbing repairs.
- Preserve volunteers stepped up and helped with additional trail maintenance and fence repair during the Preserve's maintenance position vacancy this month.
- The Preserve participated in the annual Audubon Christmas Bird Count (CBC), the longest-running national
 citizen science effort. The Preserve has been part of the CBC since its creation in the 1980s, and MCPRD is
 happy to carry on the tradition. Fifteen volunteers and the Interpretive Ranger counted over 60 species in various
 parts of the Preserve through the day.

Lake Pleasant Regional Park

- The park returned to winter hours 6 am to 8 pm, seven days per week.
- The Park Supervisor attended Trails Assessment training. Seven employees obtained their CPR/1st Aid Certification.
- Castle Creek Boat Ramp (4-Lane) is open seven days per week during the park's regular hours: 6 am to 8 pm.
- Agua Fria Bald Eagle Closure went into effect on December 15th. Eagles are already being spotted.
- Our host volunteers have arrived for the season. All host positions have been filled.

McDowell Mountain Regional Park

- Staff and volunteers are cleaning up the north end of the day-use areas: tree trimming, and redefining trails to the picnic tables, grills, and picnic areas.
- The Maintenance staff rebuilt the sink faucets in Minks Camp.
- The park is scheduling extra staff at the entry station on weekends for the large traffic volumes for the scheduled special events.
- McDowell Park hosted the following special events:
 - Ragnar Arizona Trail 2021 an overnight relay event with approximately 3,000 participants, staff, and spectators.
 - 12 Hours of Fury a twelve and a six-hour mountain bike race with approximately 500 participants, staff, and spectators.
 - The Frenzy & Mayhem 2021, a two-day bicycle and running event with 800 participants, staff, and spectators.
 - o Dawn to Dusk 2021, a 12-hour mountain bike race with approximately 800 participants.
- Staff coordinated with contractors for the Fire Fuel Reduction project on the north border (Jomax alignment).
- Staff is also coordinating with the Rio Verde FireWise community leader for a possible clean-up of the northeastern boundary.

San Tan Mountain Regional Park

- San Tan sold 765 annual passes during November and 706 in December.
- The Interpretive Ranger presented a Butterfly program to support the Department's Natural Resources butterfly monitoring initiative.
- San Tan was the host site for the annual Xterra Trail Run event that brought in 249 participants and volunteers.
- Seventeen employees from a local defense company held a team-building volunteer effort at the park helping staff complete erosion repairs on Hedgehog Trail.
- Park staff installed two dozen concrete parking blocks in the main lot received from Cave Creek Park.

Spur Cross Ranch Conservation Area

- The expanded parking lot is working out well. To date, the lot has not reached capacity yet; however, a total of 127 parking spaces have been filled by noon on a weekend day.
- The Interpretive Ranger and trail volunteers continue to complete minor trail work throughout the park.
- The park hosts are seeing an increase in attendance and are gearing up for the beginning of the year.

Usery Mountain Regional Park

- The park hosted the annual Pass Mountain Run event bringing in 249 participants.
- The 1st Annual Saguaro Soiree special event by Aravaipa Running was held with 49 women participants.
- Park volunteers have been busy removing weeds throughout the park's developed areas.
- Park staff and hosts readied the park for the upcoming busy season with trimming, painting, cleaning, organizing, etc.
- Usery Mountain Archery Club offered one tournament with 8 participants.
- Usery said goodbye to Ranger Brennan, who retired after 14 years of service.
- The playground shade cloth at the C and D group picnic suffered extensive storm damage and was replaced.
- A park host made several repairs and improvements to our Merkle trail which continually faces challenges due to weather damage.

White Tank Mountain Regional Park

- Eric Baker transferred from Lake Pleasant to fill one of the Maintenance Worker vacancies.
- The busy camping season started early this year with both Willow and Family Campgrounds completely booked every weekend of the month and quite full on the weekdays. This is the third season Willow Campground is open and it continues to get rave reviews and is increasing in popularity.
- Mangled Momentum hosted their first Duathlon at White Tank on November 27th with 43 participants.
- Twenty-seven runners participated in Racetimers Saguaro 7K on December 3rd.
- Park maintenance focused on roadside trimming this month. The White Tank main road has no shoulder and thick vegetation encroached the roadway.
- Park volunteers cleaned out the culverts underneath the Waterfall Trail before the big rains came and filled in eroded areas along the trail.
- A pot-bellied pig was found wandering the Park Nature Center parking lot. After no luck finding its owner, volunteers from the AZ Piggy Network pig rescue came and picked up the pig. A big thanks to this organization for rescuing the pig from the park.
- On December 8th, maintenance staff attended trail work training at Estrella Park offered by the Trails Specialist.
- After the White Tank entry station was hit by a vehicle in September, a rental building was placed to collect entry fees. A new temporary entrance station has been ordered which will be a more efficient workspace for employees.
- Park staff participated in the final meeting to wrap up the Park Entrance Candidate Assessment Report with the Maricopa Department of Transportation. This is an essential step in MCDOT redesigning the roadway entrance into the park to fix current traffic issues. This work needs to be completed before the new park entrance station is installed.

Maricopa County Parks Concessionaire Attendance Report (through December 2021)
