This month, we are learning all about the Chuparosa (*Justicia californica*). Here are some fun facts:

- Chuparosa has a deep root system, making it a hardy plant that evolved to survive hot, dry summers in the desert. In response to drier soils, it will shed its leaves.
- Chuparosa is a Spanish word for hummingbird, and its bright red flowers and sweet nectar attract many hummingbird species and other birds.
- It is also a larval food plant for butterflies, including the tiny checkerspot (Dymasia dymas), Texas crescent (Anthanassa texana), and the pearl crescent (Phyciodes tharos), and there are no known pests or diseases. This makes it perfect for gardens.
