This month we are learning all about the Common Chuckwalla, *Sauromalus ater*. Here are some fun and key facts:

- Chuckwallas are members of the Iguana family! But these lizards are superbly adapted to life in a dry, hot desert.
- Chuckwallas escape predators by hiding in crevices and sucking in air. This
 causes their bodies to swell and, combined with their rough scales, helps to
 wedge them tightly between rocks.
- Like some lizards, Chuckwallas can lose their tails and grow a new one. But that tail serves another purpose: storing fat for use when times are tough!
