Cactus Wren (*Campylorhynchus brunneicapillus*)

- With vivid markings and a rasping (loud) voice, this is a bird that commands you to take notice!
- They are speckled brown birds with bright white eyebrows and cinnamon sides. It has a long bill and a short round tail.
- Cactus wrens are commonly found in the southwest desert and are often seen in pairs or families hopping on the ground or from shrub to shrub. They are here year-round.
- Often posturing with spread wings and tails while conversing with one another.
- Habitat- Cactus, yucca, mesquite of arid deserts. It will often nest in Cholla, thorny shrubs, and prickly pear.
