PRINCIPLE #4: LEAVE IT AS YOU FOUND IT



 Bring along your camera to take photos instead of taking souvenirs.



Leave plants, rocks, and historical items as you find them so others can enjoy them.



Treat living plants with respect. Carving, hacking or peeling plants may kill them.

It is important to appreciate cool things in nature without taking them home with us. Today let's look at the cool leaves in the park!

There are different types of leaves on each plant for special reasons. **Big** and **small**, **has leaves** or **not**, **color** and **shape**. Most desert plants have very small leaves. This helps them conserve water. **Did you know cactus spines are modified leaves?!**

- Look at spines on the cacti and leaves on the ground, on shrubs, and on trees. Please don't pull any leaves or spines off of plants, dead or alive.
